The Story

Rebecca, an Amish girl, loves to sing but she lives in a world where solos and self-expression are forbidden. When she meets Reverend Blue, an itinerant hip-hop preacher – and former gang member – she connects with his music and joins him in his street corner "Hymn Hop" only to draw media attention and the anger of her family and community. Rebecca and Reverend Blue land a recording deal in NYC; Rebecca is thrown headlong into the world of pop culture with its idolization of celebrity, narcissism and materialism – values that are in stark contrast with her Amish way of life. Crossing Over explores the conflicts and crosscultural relationships at the heart of contemporary American life.
